Content*:	The course is for upper-intermediate level (B2) students. It is suitable for civil, mechanical and electrical engineers. The aim is to improve the communication skills and specialist language knowledge of students. The emphasis is on listening and speaking and covers topics common to all fields of engineering such as monitoring and control, procedures and precautions, and engineering design. It contains authentic activities based on everyday engineering situations from describing technical problems and solutions to working with drawings.
Prerequisites:	English knowledge of at least B 2 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) or equivalent.
